Extent of Unionization: Generally it is restricted to the building trades, culinary workers and school districts.

The local economy is based largely on agriculture, food processing, retail trade and miscellaneous manufacturing. A substantial segment of the labor force commutes to jobs in nearby cities like Redlands. Many construction and culinary hotel service workers also expand their employment opportunities by traveling to the Palm Springs desert area.

Community Facilities	HEALTH: 5 physicians/surgeons, 3 dentists and 1 chiropractor practice in Calimesa, while many health care professionals practice in nearby San Gorgonio Pass cities. The city is served by the San Gorgonio Pass Memorial Hospital, a 77 bed hospital, which is located in nearby Banning. Other hospitals that are nearby include Loma Linda University Medical Center in Loma Linda, Redlands Community Hospital in Redlands and Jerry Pettis Memorial Veteran's Hospital in Loma Linda.
	EDUCATION: The Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District and the Beaumont Unified School District serve the city. The Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District has 7 elementary schools, 2 middle schools, 1 junior high school, 1 high school, 1 community school and 1 continuation high school. The Beaumont Unified School District has 5 elementary schools, 2 middle schools, 3 high schools (including 2 continuation high schools) and 1 alternative school. Two private schools are located in Calimesa.
	Institutions of higher education accessible to Calimesa residents include the University of California, Riverside, California State University, San Bernardino, University of Redlands, Loma Linda University; Crafton Hills College in Yucaipa and Mt. San Jacinto Community College in San Jacinto.
	CULTURAL: 8 churches, 1 library, 3 newspapers, 2 cable TV systems through Time Warner and Verizon FiOS TV, 2 banks and 1 savings and loan. Recreational facilities include an 18-hole golf course, 1 Senior Center and 1 park. Other recreational venues that are accessible to Calimesa residents include the San Bernardino Mountains, Edward Dean Museum, De Anza Cycle Park, Lake Perris State Park, Wildwood Canyon State Park and Coachella Valley desert resorts.
Housing Availability,	According to the California Department of Finance, there are 3,322 housing units in Calimesa. The housing stock consists of 1,833 single detached units, 113 single attached units, 57 multiple 2 to 4 units, 64 multiple 5 plus units and 1,255 mobile homes.
Prices & Rentals	For the Third Quarter of 2007, the sales prices for new and existing homes ranged from \$188,500 to \$790,000. The average price per square foot was \$198.83. Executive level homes are available in Calimesa.
	Located in Calimesa are 2 motels, with 60 rooms. There are also 8 mobile home parks in the city, with 1,259 spaces.
Remarks	Calimesa is situated within the San Gorgonio Pass, which is a highly distinct corridor shaped by the San Bernardino Mountains and San Jacinto Mountains. The Pass itself is the quintessential transcontinental passage from the rest of the United States into Southern California, with both the Interstate 10 Freeway and the Union Pacific rail line traversing the Pass. Calimesa's master-planned Oak Valley project will increase the city's current population to 50,000. The implementation of the Calimesa Boulevard Corridor Plan will increase the city's commercial and industrial base.
