RAIL: There is no rail station or stop in the city. However, Burlington Northern Santa Fe has an intermodal facility in San Bernardino. Metrolink has commuter rail service in Riverside and San Bernardino to Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego Counties.

AIR: LA/Ontario International Airport (owned and operated by Los Angeles World Airports), 34 mi. west, is served by AeroMexico, Alaska, American, Continental, Delta, Great Lakes Airlines, Southwest Airlines, United Airlines, United Express and US Airways. Palm Springs International Airport, 38 mi. east, is served by Alaska, Allegiant Air, American, Delta Connection, Horizon Air, Sun Country, United, United Express, US Airways Express and WestJet: general facilities, 10,000 ft. runway. Banning Municipal Airport (general aviation) is 11 mi. east.

BUS: Greyhound in Banning; Riverside Transit Agency intercity and intercounty bus service, Pass Transit System local bus service and Dial-a-Ride service.

PORTS: Nearest ports are in Los Angeles-Long Beach, 74 mi. west, and San Diego, 102 mi. south.

HIGHWAYS: I-10 west to Los Angeles and I-10 east to Phoenix. Connections to I-215 north-south, 15 miles west; Calif. 91 west, 28 miles west; Calif. 60 west, 2 miles south; and Calif. 79 south, 6 miles

Industrial Sites

Calimesa has 2 industrial land use designations: Business Park and Industrial Park. There are approximately 79 acres designated as Business Park and 17 acres designated as Industrial Park, representing 1% of the city's 9,658 total acreage. This industrially zoned acreage is located along the city's Interstate 10 Corridor.

Characteristics of the Labor Force

Extent of Unionization: Generally it is restricted to the building trades, culinary workers and school districts.

The local economy is based largely on agriculture, food processing, retail trade and miscellaneous manufacturing. A substantial segment of the labor force commutes to jobs in nearby cities like Redlands. Many construction and culinary hotel service workers also expand their employment opportunities by traveling to the Palm Springs desert area.

Remarks

HEALTH: 5 physicians/surgeons, 5 dentists and 2 chiropractors practice in Calimesa, while many health care professionals practice in nearby San Gorgonio Pass cities. The city is served by the San Gorgonio Pass Memorial Hospital, a 77 bed hospital, which is located in Banning. Other hospitals in the area include Loma Linda University Medical Center in Loma Linda, Redlands Community Hospital in Redlands and Jerry L. Pettis Memorial Veterans Medical Center in Loma Linda.

EDUCATION: The Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District and the Beaumont Unified School District serve the city. The Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District has 8 elementary schools, 2 middle schools, 1 junior high school, 1 high school, 1 community day school, 1 continuation high school, 1 alternative school, 1 charter school and 1 adult school. The Beaumont Unified School District has 6 elementary schools, 2 middle schools, 1 high school, 1 continuation high school, 1 alternative school and 1 adult school. Two private schools are located in Calimesa.

Institutions of higher education accessible to Calimesa residents include the University of California, Riverside, California State University, San Bernardino, University of Redlands, Loma Linda University, Crafton Hills College in Yucaipa and Mt. San Jacinto Community College in San Jacinto.

CULTURAL: 8 churches, 1 library, 2 daily newspapers, 1 weekly newspaper, 2 cable TV systems through Time Warner and Verizon FiOS TV and 3 banks. Recreational facilities include an 18-hole golf course, 1 senior center and 1 park. Other recreational venues that are accessible to Calimesa residents include the San Bernardino Mountains, Bogart Park in Cherry Valley, Edward Dean Museum, De Anza Cycle Park, Lake Perris State Park, Wildwood Canyon State Park and Coachella Valley desert resorts.

According to the California Department of Finance, there are 3,385 housing units in Calimesa. The housing stock consists of 1,896 single detached units, 113 single attached units, 57 multiple 2 to 4 units, 64 multiple 5 plus units and 1,255 mobile homes.

The median sales price for new and existing homes is \$154,000, as reported by DataQuick for September 2010. Executive level homes are available in Calimesa.

There are 2 motels, with 60 rooms, in Calimesa.

There are 8 mobile home and RV parks in Calimesa with 1,258 mobile home spaces.

Calimesa is situated within the San Gorgonio Pass, which is a highly distinct corridor shaped by the San Bernardino Mountains and San Jacinto Mountains. The Pass itself is the quintessential transcontinental passage from the rest of the United States into Southern California, with both the Interstate 10 Freeway and the Union Pacific rail line traversing the Pass. Three zones for the Downtown Business District have been created and a new streetscape plan will help create a sense of place to attract businesses and customers. The implementation of the Calimesa Boulevard Corridor Plan will increase the city's commercial and industrial base.
