Location

Murrieta, incorporated July 1, 1991, is located at the southerly juncture of Interstate Freeways 15 and 215 in Southwest Riverside County, approximately 80 miles southeast of Los Angeles, 480 miles south of San Francisco and 60 miles north of San Diego.

AIR: County-owned French Valley Airport is a general aviation facility and handles small crafts. Approximately one-hour drive to San Diego, LA/Ontario, John Wayne and Palm Springs International Airports.

BUS: Greyhound to Riverside, San Diego and Los Angeles from Temecula, 6 mi. south; Riverside Transit Agency local and intercity bus service.

PORTS: Nearest ports are in Los Angeles-Long Beach, 80 mi. northwest, and San Diego, 60 mi. south.

HIGHWAYS: I-215 north to Riverside, I-15 north to Ontario-Los Angeles-Barstow-Las Vegas, I-15 south to San Diego County; State Route 79 north to I-10.

Industrial Sites

Murrieta has 1,200 acres planned for industrial use, representing 7 percent of the city's 18,300 acres. Over half of the industrially zoned acreage (about 700 acres) is located in the city's southern sector along the Jefferson Avenue corridor. Smaller parcels are located throughout the city. Existing land is at different stages of improvement with a sales price range of \$1.00 to \$4.75 per square foot. Murrieta's 300-acre Business Center is the city's principal industrial park. The Center is a mixed-use development and is one of Southwest Riverside County's premier master-planned industrial parks. The city also has two special business corridors featuring completed master plans.

Public Services

WATER/SEWER: Murrieta is served by four water/sewer districts: Eastern Municipal Water District, Elsinore Valley Municipal Water District, Western Municipal Water District and Rancho California Water District. Infrastructure

The city is currently developing master drainage plans. Area drainage fees are presently associated with Murrieta Creek and its tributaries and range from \$677 to \$4,139 per gross acre.

Characteristics of the Labor Force

Extent of Unionization: Generally includes retail clerks and building trades.

The broader Murrieta labor market includes populations from San Diego, Orange County and Northwest Riverside County, providing a sizable work force that is accessible for the employment needs of current and future businesses. Community Facilities

HEALTH: Murrieta currently has 173 physicians/surgeons, 86 dentists, 15 optometrists, 31 chiropractors and 6 podiatrists. Rancho Springs Medical Center, a 96-bed hospital, is located in Murrieta. Inland Valley Medical Center, a 122-bed hospital, is located in neighboring Wildomar. There are three assisted living facilities. Loma Linda University Medical Center-Murrieta, a 106-bed facility, is set to open in 2011.

EDUCATION: 11 elementary schools, 4 middle schools, 3 high schools, 1 alternative school, 1 continuation high school and 1 adult school. Five private schools are located in Murrieta. Institutions of higher education accessible to Murrieta residents include the University of California, Riverside, California State University, San Bernardino, California State University, San Marcos, Mt. San Jacinto Community College, Menifee Valley Campus and Palomar College in San Marcos (San Diego County).

CULTURAL: Murrieta has 42 churches, 1 synagogue, its own municipal library system, Time Warner cable network, two daily newspapers and one weekly newspaper, 20 banks, a 17-screen movie theater complex, a community center and a senior center. Recreational facilities include 44 parks and extensive open spaces, 4 sports parks, 1 skate park, 1 equestrian park, 2 public golf courses and 1 private course and Lake Skinner, 12 miles northeast, which has a park for camping, fishing and day use. There are hundreds of miles of equestrian trails throughout the Murrieta Valley. The 8,500-acre Santa Rosa Plateau Ecological Reserve is adjacent to Murrieta.

According to the California Department of Finance, there are 34,280 housing units in Murrieta. The housing stock consists of 24,510 single detached units, 559 single attached units, 814 multiple 2 to 4 units, 6,693 multiple 5 plus units and 1,704 mobile homes.

The median sales price for new and existing homes is \$240,000, as reported by DataQuick for September 2010.

There are 18 hotels/motels, with 1,965 rooms, in Temecula and Murrieta.

There are 2 mobile home and RV parks in Murrieta with 128 mobile home spaces.

Murrieta's traditions and values continue to grow, along with its business and population bases. With numerous lakes, mountains and wineries available to both local residents and tourists, the Murrieta Valley is developing into a major destination area. When incorporated in 1991, visionaries developed a blueprint that is now moving the City of Murrieta into the 21st Century.
